Note about grades and PowerSchool: At the beginning of a marking period very few grades have been recorded so the quarter grade at that time is not an accurate representation of your actual progress. For example, if we had 2 homeworks and a quiz and you missed one homework and were absent for the quiz due to band lessons PowerSchool will show that you are failing. On the other hand a student who has completed 2 homeworks when only homework has been graded will have a PowerSchool grade of 100. Please allow for a few weeks to elapse into each new quarter before assuming there is an error in the grading procedure.
